## Exclusive interview with Education & Sports CEC Margaret Macharia

***The County Government is charged with the responsibility of implementing ECDE centers, what are the achievements so far, how does your department ensure and maintain quality Early Childhood Education?***

Early Childhood Development Education is a devolved function. As a department we have made quite a number of strides in ensuring that quality education and especially Competence Based Curriculum (CBC) is well implemented in Nyeri County. During the year 2018/2019 the Department engaged 800 well trained ECDE Caregivers and they are all well distributed in the 435 ECDE Centers. In order to ensure that quality education and proper implementation of the curriculum, the government has engaged eight Principal Education Officers from every sub-county who supervise the caregivers. We have also embarked on capacity building of the ECDE Caregivers through training on the new CBC.

Over the past two years the department has constructed 11 new classrooms, renovated 23 schools and constructed 14 toilets across the county. Materials worth Ksh. 8.1 M have so far been bought and issued to the learners.

***What steps is the County Government taking towards rehabilitation of Vocational Training Centres, ensuring the students acquired knowledge, skills and also well equipping of institutions?***

Since the inception of County Government of Nyeri, the following VTCs have been funded through construction of work-shops;



Karundu, Nairutia, Gitero, Rukira, Othaya, Giathugu, Kaheti, Ngorano, Mung'aria, Karatina, Kianduiga, Watuka, Kimahuri, Kiamathaga, Gathinga, Kinunga, Kabebero and Gichira. The department has already disbursed Ksh42 Million for tuition in all VTCs in 2017/2018 and further Ksh 55Million in 2018/2019.

***What has the department achieved as far as the Elimu Fund Bursary is concerned in the last two years? How do you vet the needy cases?***

Elimu Fund Bursary was started in the financial year 2015/2016 through an act of the County Assembly. Funds are set aside to assist needy and bright children acquire education. The process of identifying needy cases is done through public participation in all the sub-counties. In the last two years the fund has disbursed a total of Ksh.140 Million to over 26,000 students from colleges, universities, day & boarding secondary schools, polytechnics and special schools. This includes 60 students who are needy and bright under the Governor's full scholarship.


***We understand there are Education Directors in each of the eight sub-counties in the County. Tell us how they have helped boost education in the County.***

The eight Education Directors have been great pillars in the implementation and supervision of the New Curriculums CBC in ECDE centres and CBET in VTCs. They collect data and advise the department on the requirements/needs of the institutions in their respective sub-counties. They guide the caregivers and instructors on best education practices.

***The vision statement for the Sports Directorate is to be the leading agency in the promotion of sports in the county including the improvement of sporting facilities, what has been done so far or is still being done to achieve this?***

The department through the sports directorate started up by earmarking the stadia and playgrounds in the county. So far we have upgraded at least one stadium or a play ground in the eight sub-counties. Karatina and Gichira have permanent wall and gates which are complete. Ruring'u walling is still in progress.

In Kinunga the department has done a chain link fence, an ablution block and currently a basket ball pitch is under construction. Othaya and Kiriti stadia have chain link fences. Karindi playground also has a chain link fence. At Naromoru stadium the department has constructed an ablution block which has changing rooms. All this will go a long way in ensuring that sporting activities are enhanced in the county.

***Nyeri County like other counties is home to youth with lots of talents. What are some of the steps your department has taken to nurture sporting talents?***

During the year 2017/2018 the directorate held football and volleyball tournaments for youth below 25 years and supported teams up to national level at Makueni County KYISA games. In the financial year 2018/2019, the directorate supported Cross-Country at Kabiru-ini Grounds, Athletics Championships at Ruring'u Stadium, Governors Volleyball Tournaments which had over 50 teams and early this year we held the Cross-Country Championships at Kaiyaba grounds. We also assist and support teams for persons living with disability at different levels.

***Before the ICT unit was restructured and taken to Governor's office, what achievements had you recorded in the last two years?***

The ICT Directorate was domiciled in the department of education and has been continuously supporting all the county departments on their ICT needs. We have been involved in the installation and maintenance of the Nyeri pay, integrated performance management system and Financial Management Systems (IFMS). We have been able to negotiate an MoU with Jamii telecoms to offer fiber broadband internet to ten major offices in Nyeri town and ZIZI Afrique to facilitate provision of internet to Nairutia polytechnic.

***Tell us more about Science and Technology's initiatives in your department.***

The department has been involved in organizing exhibition for VTCs to display the various technologies such as modern building technologies, electrical sys-

tems, etc. We have also been ensuring that information technology is integrated in all the learning institutions. Linkages with both local and international partners have been enhanced. A case to note is the Nairutia cooking school which is connected with an institution in Italy and online teaching is taking place. The county has also partnered with Google to sensitize all VTC students on the Google Digital Skills for Africa to train youth get new skills for a digital world, grow their career or business at their own pace, with flexible and personalized training courses.

***Majority of Nyeri residents don't know that primary and secondary education is not under your department. What have you done to sensitize them?***

We have been creating awareness to the citizens through public forums such as parents' meetings and collaboration with the National Government offices to educate the residents.

***What measures has the department taken to ensure all children of school going age get enrolled to ECDE Centres?***

The department has been raising awareness about education for all. We have been advocating on the benefits of early childhood education and through the adoption of free pre-primary education.

***Tell us about the annual Dr. Wahome Gakuru Half Marathon and the benefits to Nyeri residents.***

The Dr. Wahome Gakuru Memorial Half Marathon was initiated after the passing on of the 3rd Governor of Nyeri County who perished on 7th November 2017 through a road accident. The theme of the Marathon is "Enhancing Emergency Response" It was envisaged that the proceeds from the event would be used to refurbish an Emergency Response Centre at the County Referral Hospital but this has not been possible due to lack of adequate sponsorship. It creates an opportunity to educate the citizens on road safety. It is a way of enhancing sports tourism in our county.



Speaking during the event, Governor Kahiga noted that Nyeri residents are fully behind BBI as it will unite the country and through its economic devolution, resources allocated to the counties will be increased from 15% to 35%. Deputy Governor H.E Caroline Karugu acclaimed her support for BBI and called for the ini-

tiative to factor in cancer treatment, as it is burdening a lot of people in the country.

Hon. Ngunjiri Wambugu reiterated Governor's mes-



sage noting that BBI will unite the country and proposed that people's rights to own property anywhere to be respected.

## Iria-ini ward youth public participation

**Y**outh from Iria-ini Ward, Othaya sub-county convened at Othaya CDF hall located in Othaya town for a public participation forum organized by the County Government of Nyeri through the Department of Gender, Youth and Social Services in collaboration with Iria-ini ward MCA Hon. John Theuri.

The forum aimed at giving the youth a chance to air their proposals on how they can be assisted with the county youth ward-specific budgetary allocation to start or boost self help projects.

It was noted that most young people present invest as a group and already have existing businesses and would like to be facilitated with equipment and tools to help with value addition or boost and grow their businesses.

Speaking during the event, the Department's CEC Esther Ndung'u assured the youth of the government's commitment in youth empowerment and highlighted on the county government's initiatives on youth empowerment.

Additionally, she assured them that her office will be working closely with the area MCA to see that their proposals have started being worked on as soon every interested group submits their business plan and proposal.

The youth thanked H.E the Governor Mutahi Kahiga and the MCA for the initiative which will be beneficial to them.

Ksh. 1.5Million has been allocated to empower Iria-ini youth with tools and equipment for business start-up or to boost their existing businesses.

Among the equipment proposed by the youth includes, egg incubators and generators, car wash machines, salon and barber shop machines, mat making machines, welding machines among others.

Officials from Uwezo Fund, Equity Foundation and Kenya Medical Training College also highlighted on various opportunities available for youth.

# Health workers training on emergency care

*The training dubbed, The Emergency Care Course (TECC), was aimed at equipping the trainees with skills on timely emergency care for all.*

16 healthcare providers drawn from the outpatient and emergency department underwent training on emergency care which kicked off on Monday 24th Feb 2020. This came courtesy of a partnership between Emergency Medicine Kenya Foundation (EMKF) and the County Government of Nyeri.

The training dubbed, The Emergency Care Course (TECC), was aimed at equipping the trainees with skills on timely emergency care for all.

Among the activities the training involved include ; management of trauma, pediatric emergencies, skills on use of ECG machine, defibrillation, pelvic binder application, splinting, chest tube insertion, ultrasound in trauma, fixing of intraosseous line and advanced airway management. Thereafter, they sat for an exam on Friday, 28th Feb 2020 and issued with certificates valid for the next two years preceding training on the same. Dr. Tru Mochache, a medical officer and lead trainer pledged her full support and that of the organization towards realization on the importance of emergency care

through such forums. She also assured that they are targeting health gatekeepers from all the 47 counties and Nyeri County is privileged to be the fourth county. The director of health services, Dr. Nelson Muriu urged the participants to take full advantage of such sessions and called them for an initiative to share the knowledge. He noted the department is supportive of the activities that are aimed at better healthcare delivery in line with Kenya's UHC agenda.

The County Government of Nyeri through the Department of Gender, Youth and Social Services met with stakeholders to firm up the committee that is to be involved in preparation of the event. The stakeholders also deliberated over rallying stakeholders across the country towards

supporting and getting involved in the preparation. The meeting was chaired by the County Secretary Ben Gachichio who assured the stakeholders that the county government is in full support of the event and will be working together with the scouts movement, parliamentarians, Red Cross and other delegates from all over the country to see success of the union's assembly.

# Launch of Nyeri women prison discharge board

The County Government of Nyeri through the Department of Gender, Youth and Social Services joined other stakeholders at King'ong'o women's prison located in Nyeri Central sub-county, Rware ward for the launch of Prison Discharge Board. The prison board is in compliance with Chapter 90 sect. 112 of the Kenyan constitution and has rallied together representatives from religious, governmental and non-governmental organizations. The purpose of the board is to interview all imprisoned individuals within the final three months towards their due date of discharge.

The interview helps the board discover what the inmate had been through before imprisonment, their experience during rehabilitation into civil life at the prison and possible identification of a need so that the board can then accord the individual appropriate assistance that will help them settle down once they leave the prison. On listening to individual cases, each member of the board will pledge the kind of help each will offer the individual to ensure that their life is not going to be the same again.

The initiative was flagged off by the County Probation Director Jane Nyaguthii and kicked off immediately where 10 inmates were interviewed. The County Government of Nyeri as a board member promised to continue partnering with the members in walking the inmates through their journey of behaviour change, creating awareness in the society to mitigate stigmatization of the individuals once they leave prison and in offering assistance to help start and establish a productive life.

**RE: RECRUITMENT OF ENUMERATORS TO UNDERTAKE FARMER REGISTRATION FOR THE E-VOUCHER NATIONAL VALUE CHAINS SUPPORT PROGRAM (NVSP)**

The National value chain support programme (NVSP) is a programme under the ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries, Cooperative, State Department of Crop Development and Agricultural Research, whose main objective is providing approximately 1.4 million high needs farming households with access to a wide range of inputs through nationwide e-voucher subsidies as envisaged in the agricultural sector transformation and growth strategy (ASTGS).

In preparation for 2020 long rains cropping season (March/April 2020), the programme intends to support a total of 3,312 smallholders to medium farmers in Nyeri County with inputs package to undertake Coffee production.

To successfully roll out the E- voucher system, the programme intends to urgently carryout a farmer registration exercise in Konyu Ward-Mathira East and Karima Ward –Nyeri South). **25 enumerators will be recruited** per pilot ward.

The criteria for selecting the enumerators are:

1. Minimum academic qualifications – KCSE Mean grade C
2. Continuing university students and graduates would be an added advantage.
3. Must be computer literate and able to use a smartphone.
4. Must have a working smartphone.
5. **MUST** be a resident of the ward where the exercise will be undertaken.
6. Must be able to communicate in Kiswahili and the local dialect.
