

THE NYERI COUNTY FINANCE ACT, 2018

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THE NYERI COUNTY FINANCE ACT, 2018

AN ACT of the County Assembly of Nyeri to provide for the amendment of the Revenue Administration Act, 2014 and Finance Act, 2017 in relation to taxes, fees and charges for various services and other revenue raising measures and for matters incidental thereto.

ENACTED by the County Assembly of Nyeri as follows—

Short Title and Commencement. **1.** This Act may be cited as the Nyeri County Finance Act, 2018 and shall come into operation upon publication.

Application **2.** This Act shall apply within Nyeri County.

Interpretation **3.** In this Act –

“authorized officer” means a county revenue collector

“Electronic Single business Permit” means an original permit issued online under this Act;(should be E permit/ certificate/ Licence)

“Certificate” means an original certificate issued under the Act

“County government” means the County Government of Nyeri

“Executive Member” means the County Executive Member Responsible for Finance;

“county public officer” has the same meaning as in the County Governments Act, 2012;

“county revenue receiver” means a person appointed under section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act

“county revenue collector” means a public officer appointed under section 158 of the Public Finance Management Act

“Director” means the office of the County Director for Revenue as established under the Nyeri Revenue and Administration Act 2014

“display advertisements and signage” includes signposts, banners and billboards

“livestock” includes goats, cattle and donkeys

“person” includes a body corporate

“Receipt” means an original receipt issued under the Act,(issued electronically or manually)

“Registrar” has the same meaning as provided for under the Land Act 2012 and includes the Chief Officer responsible for lands in the County Government in case of unregistered lands.

“Urban Areas” means Karatina Town and Nyeri Town

“Semi Urban Areas” means Mukurweini town, Othaya town, Chaka Town, Narumoru Town, Mweiga Town and Kiawara Town

“Rural Areas” means all other areas and trading Centres in Nyeri County.

Objectives

4. The object and purpose of this Act is to set out the revenue collection areas for the financial year 2018-2019.

**PART II—CHARGES, RENT, TRADE LICENCE,
RATES AND INFRASTRUCTURE
MAINTENANCE FEES**

General fees and Charges.

5. (1) A person who wishes to carry out the activities specified in the Schedules shall pay the fees specified in the relevant parts of the Schedule.

- (2) A person who wishes to carry out any of the activities which require a permit under the Schedule shall apply for a permit from the County Government.

- (3) The County Government shall grant the relevant permit to the applicant upon payment of fees prescribed in the relevant Part of the Schedules.

- (4) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.

Licence fees

6. (1) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in the Second Schedule without a valid license issued by the County Government.

(2) A person who intends to carry out any of the businesses listed in the Schedules shall apply for a licence or permit from the Sub-county office where the business is located, or from a designated agent as may be prescribed by the County government from time to time.

(3) A person who applies for a licence under subsection (2) shall be issued with a licence upon payment of the fee specified in the Schedule.

(4) A licence or permit issued under subsection (3) shall be visibly displayed at the business premise at all times.

(5) Business permits shall not be issued for businesses carried out in a building where land and ground rent are in arrears.

(6) A permit may be transferred by the holder to any person upon application to the Director and upon payment of the prescribed fee.

(7) An authorized officer may enter any business premise at any time to inspect or inquire if the conditions attached to the permit are being observed.

(8) Anyone who interferes with entry and prohibits inspection of a premise by an authorized officer commits an offence.

(9) If any permit contravenes any of the conditions set out under any law the County government may refuse to grant or renew it.

(10) The County government may issue consolidated permits to traders who conduct different businesses within the same premises.

(11) Any person carrying out a business must obtain a business permit by the 31st March of the current trading year for Renewals or; before the start of operations for new applicant.

(12) Any person who makes a late payment for a permit shall be liable to payment of penalties as prescribed in the schedules.

(13) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.

Parking spaces, fees and penalties.

7. (1) Vehicles shall stand in, be driven into and be driven out of a designated parking place or space so that they do not stand in, or pass over part of one parking space and part of another or any line, stand or other indication marking the limit of a parking space.

(2) A person who uses a parking space shall be charged fees specified in the Schedule.

(3) A person who fails to pay the required fees for a parking space may have

their vehicle clamped or towed for impounding in a police station or County government yard until such fee or penalty as specified in the schedule has been fully paid.

(4) There shall be penalties for late payment of parking fees, impounding, clamping of vehicles, towing or withdrawal of court bond as specified in the Schedule.

(5) A person who interferes with a vehicle clamp commits an offence.

(6) A person shall not leave on or in any public road or street or public place any vehicle, cycle, cart, box, crate, bin or any article whatsoever such as to cause obstruction to a parking bay or road.

(7) Any vehicle, cycle, handcart, box, crate, bin or any article left on or in a public road, street or public place in contravention of sub section (6) may be removed by the County government to a place appointed and no person shall be entitled to receive the same until he shall have paid to the County government a prescribed fee as provided for in the schedule.

(8) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence and shall be liable upon conviction to a fine of Kshs.3,000 or in the case of continued offence to a further Kshs. 5,000 for each day during which such offence continues or to imprisonments for a term not exceeding six months or both such fine and imprisonment.

Lands, housing
and physical
planning fees

8. (1) The County government shall offer the services specified in the Schedule upon receipt of payment of the fees prescribed in the last column of that Schedule.

(2) A person who constructs a building within the County without an approved plan commits an offence.

(3) A person occupying a plot, stall or a house leased or rented out by the County government shall pay rent, at the rate specified in the Schedule.

(4) The rent referred to under subsection (3) shall be due—

- (a) in case of a plot, on the 1st day of January in each year; and
- (b) in case of a house or a stall, on the last day of each month.

- (5) A person who contravenes the provisions of subsections (3) or 4(b) may be evicted for failure to pay the rent for three consecutive months.
- (6) A penalty of three per cent per month or a part thereof shall be charged on the outstanding rent on a plot that remains unpaid after 31st day of March.
- (7) The County government may repossess the plot referred to under subsection 3 if the person fails to pay the rent for more than three consecutive years.
- (8) A person shall not advertise any construction works within the County unless authorized to do so by the relevant County government department responsible for physical planning.
- (9) A person who wishes to advertise any construction works shall pay the fee as provided in the Schedule upon applying for a permit to the County government department responsible for physical planning.
- (10) The County government may grant the permit referred to under subsections 8 and 9 upon payment of fees prescribed in the Schedule.
- (11) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.

Rates

- 9.** (1) A person who owns a rateable property(s) in the County shall pay rates and, or rent as specified in the Schedule
- (2) A penalty of 3% compound interest shall be charged on all outstanding rates or rent until fully paid
- (3) Rates shall be paid to –
 - a) the receiver of revenue; or
 - b) a collection agent authorized in writing by the county executive committee member;
 - c) or any other person authorized in writing by the county executive committee member to collect rates.
- (4) The receiver of revenue shall issue a receipt for the payment of rates to the person who paid the rates.
- (5) The County government may charge interest on any amount of rates remaining unpaid after the day on which the rates became payable.
- (6) (a) The County government shall recover any overdue rates and penalty interest as a debt.

- (b) The overdue rates and penalty interest are recoverable in a court of competent jurisdiction as a debt due and owing to the County government from the person liable for payment of the rates.
- (c) Subject to subsection (7a), the Civil Procedure Act CAP. 21 and the rules made under that Act apply to recovery proceedings.
- (d) A certificate signed by the receiver of revenue certifying that;
 - i. an amount of rates is or was due and payable on or before a certain date; and
 - ii. the rates are overdue and penalty interest is payable; is admissible as evidence against the defendant in proceedings under this section, and is prima facie evidence as to the matters certified.
- (e) Before commencing proceedings against a person under this section, the Director of Revenue shall send a written notice to the person at his last known address—
 - i. setting out the amount of the overdue rates, including any penalty interest; and
 - ii. stating that unless the overdue amount and penalty interest are paid in full within such period as is specified in the notice or an agreement is reached to repay the overdue amount and penalty interest; recovery proceedings against the person for the overdue amount and penalty interest will be commenced as soon as practicable after the end of the period so specified.

(7)

This subsection applies if the owner of rateable property owes the County government for overdue rates on the property, including any penalty interest;

- a. The overdue rates and any penalty interest are a charge on the rateable property.

- b. If the title to the rateable property is registered under the Land Registration Act 2012, the County government may deliver a notification of such charge, in the prescribed form, to the Registrar who shall register it against the title to that property.
 - c. Subject to any national law, the charge has priority over any other encumbrances over the rateable property.
 - d. If the overdue rates and penalty interest are paid, the County government shall lodge with the Registrar –
 - i. a request to release the charge over the rateable property, in the prescribed form; and
 - ii. a certificate signed by the county executive committee member that states the overdue rates and charges have been paid.
- (8)

If an amount of rates payable on a rateable property has been in arrears for three years or more, the County government may sell the property in accordance with this section.

(9)

Before the County government sells the rateable property, the County Executive Member shall send a notice to the owner of the rateable property -

- i. stating the period for which the rates have been in arrears; and
 - ii. stating the amount of the total liability for rates, including penalty interest, presently outstanding in relation to the property; and
 - iii. stating that if that amount is not paid in full within one month after service of the notice or such longer time but not exceeding 90 days as the executive member may allow, the County Government intends to sell the property for non-payment of rates.
- (10)

(a) If the executive member cannot, after making reasonable inquiries, ascertain the name and address of a person to whom a notice is to be sent under subsection (9) and the executive member considers that it is unlikely that a notice

sent under subsection (9) would come to the attention of the person to whom it is to be sent;

- i. the executive member shall cause service of the notice to be effected by placing a copy of the notice in a newspaper of national circulation; and
- ii. by leaving a copy of the notice in a conspicuous place on the rateable property.

- (b) If the outstanding amount is not paid in full within the time allowed under subsection (8b), the county executive committee member may proceed to have the property sold.
 - (c) The sale shall be by public auction and the executive member may set a reserve price based on a professional valuation report for the purposes of the auction.
 - (d) The auction shall be advertised in a newspaper of national circulation and the date of the auction shall be not less than 30 days from the date of the advertisement.
 - (e) If, before the date of the auction, the outstanding amount of rates and penalty interest, and the costs incurred by the County government in proceeding under this section are paid to the County government, the executive member shall call off the auction.
 - (f) If an auction fails, the County government may sell the rateable property by private contract for the best price that it can reasonably obtain.
- (11)

- (a) Any money received by the County government in respect of the sale of rateable property under this section is to be applied in the order as follows-
 - i. in paying the costs of the sale and any other costs incurred in proceeding under that section;
 - ii. in discharging any liabilities to the County government in respect of the property;
 - iii. in discharging any liability to the State for charges or taxes, or any prescribed liability to the State in respect of the property;

- iv. in discharging any liabilities secured by registered mortgages, encumbrances or charges;
- v. in discharging any other mortgages, encumbrances and charges of which the County government has notice;
- vi. in payment to the owner of the property.

- b) If the owner of the rateable property cannot be found after making reasonable inquiries as to his or her whereabouts, an amount payable to the owner must be dealt with as unclaimed money under the Unclaimed Financial Assets Act 2011.
- c) If property is sold in pursuance of a sale under sub section (8) an instrument of transfer under the County government's public seal will, on registration, operate to vest title to the property in the purchaser.
- d) The title vested in a purchaser under subsection (18) is deemed to be free of all mortgages and charges.
- e) An instrument of transfer in pursuance of a sale under sub section(8) shall, when lodged with the Registrar, be accompanied by a statutory declaration made by the county executive committee member stating that the requirements of sub section (8) in relation to the sale of the property have been observed.
- f) If it is not reasonably practicable to obtain the duplicate certificate of title to property that is sold under subsection (8), the Registrar may register a transfer despite the non-production of the duplicate, but in that event will cancel the existing certificate of title for the property and issue a new certificate in the name of the transferee.
- g) The use of one kind of remedy to recover overdue rates and penalty interest does not limit any other remedy that the County government has to recover overdue rates and penalty interest

Refusal to issue permits, licences and permissions for unpaid rateable property

10.

- 1) This section applies if the owner of a rateable property owes the County Government for overdue rates, including any penalty or interest.

- 2) The County government may in relation to the rateable property do any or all of the following-
 - a) refuse to issue or renew a permit or licence to the owner of the rateable property in respect of any business operated by the owner in or on the rateable property;
 - b) refuse any permission or approval relating to the subdivision of the rateable property by the owner;
 - c) refuse any permission or approval relating to planning, building or other activities to be undertaken by the owner of the rateable property in or on the property;
 - d) refuse to provide any other service to the owner of the rateable property, being a service that relates to the use or proposed use of the rateable property by the owner; until the overdue rates and penalty interest are paid in full.
- 3) Any waiver, remission, reduction, deferment or postponement of payments of rates and penalty interest, including any payments by installments, shall be in accordance with Nyeri County Tax Waivers Administration Act 2014.
- 4) Any registration of an instrument referred to in section 38 of the Land Registration Act 2012 relating to property in the County is subject to the County government issuing a statement certifying that all outstanding rates and penalty interest have been paid in accordance with that section.

Advertisement
and Signage

- 11.** (1) A person who wishes to display advertisements and signage shall apply for a permit from the County Government.
- (2) The County Government may grant the necessary permit referred to under subsection (1) upon payment of the fees
- (3) prescribed in the Schedule.
- (4)

Any display advertisements or signage placed anywhere within the County without the necessary permit shall be removed by the County Government.

A person who displays advertisements and signage without the necessary permit shall be liable to a fine as provided for in the relevant schedule.

- (5) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.

Market Fees

- 12.** (1) No public market shall be provided within the area of jurisdiction of the County government, otherwise than by the County government and no person shall sell or buy goods in or use a public market except with the consent of the County government given by the Director of Revenue or such other person as may necessarily secure the effectual control of such markets
- (2) The Director of revenue may in consultation with the executive member appoint a market master for coordination of revenue collection within a market.
There shall be a fee for access of markets or stalls for the sale of goods, foods, animals or products as specified in the Schedule.
- (3) A person who wishes to access the markets or the stalls for the sale of goods, foods, animals or products shall pay the fees specified in the relevant part of the Schedule.
- (4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.
- (5) The Executive member responsible for trade may for purpose of better management of markets gazette regulations for appointment of market committees and their mandate.

Hire of Machinery

- 13.** (1) A person shall not use County government machinery without the relevant authority from the County government.
- (2) A person who wishes to use County government machinery shall apply to the relevant department within the County government.
- (3) The relevant County government department may grant the application under subsection (2) upon the payment of the fee specified in the Schedule.

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(4) A person who contravenes the provision of this section commits an offence.

Fees for County Stadium, Grounds or Halls

- 14.**
- (1) A person shall not use County Stadia, grounds or hall without authority from the County government.
 - (2) A person who wishes to use County Stadia, ground or hall shall apply for a permit to the relevant County government department.
 - (3) The relevant County government department may grant the permit referred to in subsection (2) upon payment of fees prescribed in respective column of the relevant part of that Schedule.

Livestock and Agricultural fees

- 15.**
- (1) A person shall not carry out any agricultural business or provide the services thereto without the authority of the County government.
 - (2) A person who wishes to carry out a business or provide the services in livestock and agricultural business shall apply for a permit or certificate to the relevant County government Department.
 - (3) The relevant County government department may grant the permit under subsection (2) upon payment of fees prescribed in the schedule.
 - (4) A person who keeps, maintains or grazes livestock within an urban area commits an offence.
 - (5) An authorized officer may confiscate livestock found within an urban area and such livestock once confiscated shall be held in custody of the County Government for not more than three days, whereby if not claimed by the legal owner shall be sold through public auction or donated to a charitable organization.
 - (6) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.

Natural Resources Extraction and maintenance fee

- 16.**
- (1) A person who operates a quarry or transports quarry products, red soil, manure, kaolin and other goods from, within, into or through the County shall pay the fee specified in the Schedule for the maintenance of infrastructure.

- (2) A person transporting agricultural products from or into the County shall be charged the fee specified in the Schedule for the maintenance of infrastructure.
- (3) A person who fails to pay the fee in sub section (1) and (2) may have their vehicle impounded until the fee is fully paid including any penalties as may be prescribed in the schedule.
- (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) and (2), transportation of quarry products, red soil, manure, kaolin and any other goods requiring the payment of cess shall be undertaken between the hours of 6:00 a.m and 6:00 p.m. on all days except Sunday.
- (5) Any person wishing to transport quarry products after the stipulated time and day under subsection (4) above shall seek authority from the County and pay in advance such fees that are payable.
- (6) A person who contravenes provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence.

Payment

17.

PART III- PAYMENT

- (1) A person who fails to pay a fee or penalty as provided for in this Act commits an offence.
- (2) Any payment to the County government shall be paid through an authorized channel.
- (3) An officer appointed by the County government to collect revenue shall have an identification card and, or a County government uniform issued by the County government.
- (4) A County government official receipt shall be issued for all payments made to the County government.
- (5) A person shall not receive or collect any money on behalf of the County government unless he has been appointed to do so or has authority as the receiver and collector of the County revenue.

(6) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

General Penalty **18.**

PART IV - OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

(1) A person who commits an offence under this Act for which no penalty is provided shall be liable, upon conviction, to a fine not exceeding a hundred thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both.

(2) A person who hinders, obstructs, interferes or prevents an authorized officer, or any other person duly authorized in writing by the Executive Member in exercising the powers under this Act shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine of one hundred thousand shillings or to an imprisonment term not exceeding one year or to both.

Fines and Penalties **19.**

A person who contravenes the provisions of this Act shall pay a penalty or fine where provided for in the schedule.

Offences by County Government staff **20.**

A staff of the County government or any other person having duty to perform under this Act:-

- (a) Makes a false entry, in any record, or document which they are required to keep or makes an entry which they know or have reasonable cause to believe to be false or do not believe to be true;
- (b) Willfully refuses to do anything which they know or have reasonable cause to know is required to be done by them;
- (c) Interferes with any other person or process under this Act, so as to defeat the provisions or requirements of this Act;
- (d) Where required under this Act to do anything to give effect to the provisions of this Act, fails to do such things;
- (e) Without reasonable cause omits to do something in breach of his duty under this Act;
- (f) Willfully contravenes the provision of this Act to give undue advantage or a favour to another person;

(g) Fails to prevent or report to the County government or any other relevant authority, the commission of an offense under this Act;

commits an offense and is liable on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred thousand shillings or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or both.
