



# How Nyerians will benefit from Finance Bill 2020

The recent signing of the Nyeri County Finance Bill, 2020 into an Act by Nyeri Governor H.E. Mutahi Kahiga is set to benefit its citizenry.

The bill, aimed at being a 'mwananchi' friendly one has not increased the charges but has instead widened the local revenue base through inclusion of new revenue streams.

In Nyeri town, more parking slots have been created. However, the Act ensures that the Nyeri town street vehicle parking fees will be maintained at Sh 50 per day.

The governor lauded the Nyeri Coun-



ty Assembly for working hand in hand with the executive, stating that this will ensure services will be rendered to Nyerians on time.

Nyeri Speaker Hon. John Kaguchia highlighted that this is the third Finance Bill to be signed since the inauguration of the current government, consequent-

ly on time, unlike during the former regime where there were delays due to wrangling. He further noted that this would not have been realized were it not for the cordial relationship between the executive and county assembly.

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## How the Nyeri citizenry will benefit from the signing of the Finance Bill 2020 into an Act

Nyeri County Assembly Finance and Economic Planning Committee Chairman Hon. Erastus Muriuki said the committee received memorandums from five groups. The groups included Nyeri County Budget Coalition, Matatu sector, Pakoni Market traders in Karatina town, Kimathi Estate tenants, King'ong'o Vibanda traders which were seriously scrutinized and reviewed by the committee.

The committee considered the petitions and came up with the following measures;

- Penalties for 'Matatu' industry reduced from Kshs. 3,000 to Kshs. 2,500.
- Kiaruhiu Market Stalls charges reduced from Kshs. 1,000 to Kshs. 500.
- Karatina Pakoni market traders will be paying Kshs. 300 monthly which is Kshs. 3,600 annually.
- King'ong'o market traders will be paying Kshs. 250 down from Kshs. 1,300 similar to Kamakwa and other areas.
- Kimathi estate tenants; the deadline of payments was on 5th of every month now it has been pushed to 10th of every month. Penalties on rent

also reduced from 25% to 15%.

- Ruring'u plot block 667 will be paying a charge of 0.5% of the plot value as land rates.
- Cultural Centre charges reduced from Kshs. 10,000 to Kshs. 8,000.

The County Government of Nyeri has also established new revenue streams which include:

- Establishment of an amenity ward at Mt. Kenya Hospital.
- Introduction of charges for Power generation (hydro, solar, wind).
- Rehabilitation centre charges (Karia Rehabilitation Centre) which will cost Kshs. 60,000. The charges will be covered by NHIF.
- Coffee millers charges previously paid to the National Government will now be paid to the County Government.
- There are upcoming new markets; at the Nyeri Bus Termini, Asian Quarters and the Chaka market which will be run by the County Government.



The Nyeri County annual budget for the Financial year 2020/2021 is Ksh 7.78 billion out of which the County Government of Nyeri is targeting to collect Ksh. 1 million in this financial year.

The revenue raised will ensure that Nyeri residents enjoy the real fruits of devolution since the money will be ploughed back to render essential services and initiate development.

The county is also targeting revenues including those from the four Level 4 hospitals in the county (Karatina, Mukurwe-ini, Othaya and Mt Kenya hospitals) after the UHC pilot programme came to an end.

# Governor launches Kshs. 30 million Enterprise Development Fund

H.E Governor Mutahi Kahiga officially launched the annual Kshs. 30 million Enterprise Development Fund which has enabled creation of employment through business expansion and technology acquisition, asset finance and promoted self-employment.

Nyeri County Enterprise Development Fund (EDF) is among the flagship programs established under the Nyeri County Enterprise Development Fund Act 2018 with the objective of enterprise development in Nyeri County.

It offers Business Financing, LPO and LSO financing, Technology Acquisition, Asset Financing – the asset is the security and Agribusiness Financing at an affordable interest rate of 5% p.a. on reducing balance down from 7%.

The fund received Kshs. 30 million from the County Assembly allocations and has seen over 42 enterprises benefitting with loans worth Kshs. 15.7 million since inception three years ago. 78 more are expected to benefit with loans worth Kshs. 21.4 million in the coming days.

During the annual event, Governor Kahiga called for accountability and urged the groups to well utilize the funds provided.

He also appealed to the groups to honour their loan obligations as the growth of the fund significantly depended on the loan repayment commitment of the beneficiaries.

Trade and Enterprise Committee chairman Hon. David Kabatha thanked the governor for this noble program noting that it has been ab-

sorbed by groups from 28 wards and will be of significant help to the beneficiaries.

Trade CEC Diana Kendi noted that the EDF has been well received seeing that it has had a 100 percent uptake.

Some of the beneficiaries were boutiques, electronic suppliers, hotels, restaurants, boda boda and tuk tuk riders. Five motorcycles and two tuk tuks were flagged off by the governor during the launch.



# Nyeri CECs sign performance contracts

*Performance contracting is aimed at improving efficiency in the management of public service. The contracts serve as the benchmark for evaluating performance. The signing of PCs is conducted annually so that the executives can effectively implement the set targets as outlined in the CIDPs and ADPs.*

The Nyeri County Executive Committee Members signed their Performance Contracts (PCs) as a sign of their continued commitment to achieving specific service delivery targets that are verifiable and auditable. The exercise was overseen by Nyeri Governor H.E Mutahi Kahiga.

The annual performance contracting is aimed at improving efficiency in the management of public service. The contracts serve as the benchmark for evaluating performance.

While this comes belatedly after a lapse of three months

due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the CECs have expressed their commitment to working diligently and further serving the citizenry. Challenges that have emerged are aligned to the delay of resource disbursement to the counties. In the current financial year, the resources have not been released to the counties in the last four months. However, things are now looking up following the assenting into law, the County Revenue Allocation bill by H.E President Uhuru Kenyatta.

# Exclusive interview with Co-operative Director, Peter Theuri



*Nyeri County has a total of 166 active cooperative societies. They have an asset base of over Ksh. 19 billion, share capital of over Ksh. 1.7 billion, membership of over 450,000 and an estimated annual turnover of 6 billion.*

## *What is a cooperative?*

A cooperative society is an autonomous association of persons united voluntarily to meet their common economic, social and cultural needs and aspirations through a jointly-owned and democratically run enterprise.

## *What is the role of the cooperative directorate?*

The Directorate of Cooperatives plays a great role in the promotion of cooperative movement in the county. Some of our key roles are as follows;

- Promotion and processing applications for registration of new societies.
- Carrying out cooperative audits, inspections and investigations.
- Carrying out training needs assessment for cooperative societies and conducting training, education and information sharing to co-operatives.
- Coordinating and monitoring of cooperative indemnity by cooperative leaders.

- Promotion of cooperative ventures and innovations.
- Cooperative dispute resolution.
- Enforcing Co-operative Societies Act, rules and by-laws.
- Carrying out continuous and compliance audits.

## *How many active cooperatives per sector, per activity and investments do we have in the county?*

Nyeri County has a total of 166 active cooperative societies. Out of these; 23 are coffee societies, 28 are dairy cooperatives, four are investment cooperatives, 13 housing societies, 57 savings and credit societies (Saccos), 37 transport societies, two unions and two from other categories. Of the 57 Saccos, eight offer front office services and the other 49 have only back office services.

## *Give us a brief history of cooperatives in Nyeri County.*

In Nyeri County, the oldest active co-operative society

is Ihururu dairy farmers' co-operative society registered on 6th August, 1949 as Ihururu dairy men's cooperative society limited. Over the years, the co-operative movement has grown to the 166 active co-operative societies discussed earlier. They have an asset base of over Ksh. 19 billion, share capital of over Ksh. 1.7 billion, membership of over 450,000 and an estimated annual turnover of 6 billion.

## *What are the guiding principles of the cooperatives?*

The cooperative societies operations are governed by

the Co-operative Societies Act Cap 490 of the laws of Kenya and the Sacco societies Act Cap 490B of 2008 which regulates the operations of the Saccos offering front office services.

There are seven guiding principles that co-operative societies have to follow. They include: Voluntary and open membership, Democratic member control, Economic participation by members, Autonomy and independence, Education, training and information, Cooperation among cooperatives and Concern for community.





### *Brief us on the different types of cooperatives in the county*

There are different types of cooperative societies in Nyeri County. They include:

- We have marketing co-operative societies that entail members coming together to find a market for their produce. These include Coffee marketing co-operative societies, dairy marketing co-operative societies, fish marketing co-operatives society among others.
- Savings and credit cooperative societies commonly referred to as Saccos where members pull their resources together to access affordable credit and share returns at the end of the year. They can be categorized into urban Saccos, rural Saccos and transport Saccos.
- Housing and investment cooperative societies where members jointly own properties and get returns from them.
- And lastly we have Co-operative unions that have membership restricted to primary co-operative societies who come together to achieve their common objectives.

*The youth and women have been complaining that they*

*have been left behind in management of those cooperatives. Is it true that they are never involved or included in the management?*

As a directorate we have done a lot of sensitization to cooperative societies and ensured that there is no discrimination on the basis of gender. We now have many women and youth serving in leadership positions in co-operatives with some societies incorporating gender mainstreaming in their by-laws in line with the Constitution of Kenya 2010.

*Governance issues have been a challenge in many organizations. Can you highlight what the county government is doing to enhance the same in co-operatives?*

The County Government of Nyeri has continued to enhance corporate governance in our co-operatives. During the 2018/2019 financial year, the county government through the Department of trade, tourism and cooperative development initiated a capacity building program for co-operative leaders fully paid by the county government that was hosted and conducted by Dedan

Kimathi University of Technology. They were trained on negotiation skills, conflict resolution, good governance practices, financial management and use of technology in co-operatives. This will be an annual program all geared to improving how co-operatives in Nyeri are managed and that members reap maximum benefits. We have a co-operative audit section that provides audit and advisory services to the societies. The unit audits a substantive number of co-operatives in the county and advises them on proper accounting procedures. We preside over elections ensuring that proper vetting is done and that the leaders elected comply with the provisions of the law to enhance accountability and integrity. We have also established a compliance unit within our co-operative directorate that undertakes regular compliance checks and advises the management for corrective actions.

*What are the challenges encountered in the Cooperative sector?*

There are a number of challenges encountered in the cooperative sector which include: mismanagement and corruption, lack of leadership and management skills leading to poor governance, aged membership


hence low productivity, low adoption of technology in some cooperative societies leading to inefficiency in service delivery and political and leadership wrangles between the former, current and aspiring leaders.

*What are the future plans for the cooperatives in Nyeri?*

The directorate plans to continue promoting value addition on cooperative's products and also looks forward to supporting the youth in cooperative ventures and innovations through cooperative societies.

The directorate will continuously review and develop the legal framework governing cooperatives to ensure it addresses the emerging issues in the sector.

As a way of enhancing cooperative governance in cooperatives the county government through the directorate of cooperative development will continue to carry out training needs assessments and conduct capacity building for cooperative leaders and staff.



# Continued mutual collaboration between CGN and KRA

A team from the Kenya Revenue Authority met with Nyeri Governor H.E Mutahi Kahiga to deliberate on revenue mobilization within Nyeri County.

As the team hailed the County Government of Nyeri for its partnership with KRA in the discharge of its mandate, discussions on key parameters emerged. These parameters include Capacity Building to County Finance/Revenue Officers and creation of awareness on tax matters e.g on Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). The other dynamics are on Liquor Licensing where KRA has requested to be co-opted to assist in recruiting and enforcing compliance in tax paying culture.

KRA also sought assistance in training Taxpayer's Data for ease of identifying non-compliant taxpayers e.g from Single Business Permit. The KRA team reiterated that it is willing to collaborate with County Government of Nyeri to mobilize and collect revenue (structured) on behalf of the county.

The KRA team led by Tobias Konyango said they were grateful to the County Government of Nyeri for its consideration regarding their request.

Governor Kahiga remarked that the issues would be looked into by all the stakeholders and further discussions will be held on the same.

# Preparations for Breast Cancer Awareness Campaign kicks off

H.E Governor Mutahi Kahiga met with officials from Nyeri private hospitals as preparations for Breast Cancer Awareness campaign kicks off.

The campaigns will be launched in Nyeri on 15th October and continue to 15th November, 2020.

Governor Kahiga who was accompanied by Nyeri Deputy Governor H.E Dr. Caroline Karugu said there is need to bring on board all stakeholders in order to launch a vigorous campaign in the county.

There will be mass screening for breasts and prostate cancer in both men and women.

The governor also noted that there is need for the education sector to join hands during the campaigns to cover a huge population.

Officials present were drawn from Tumu Tumu Hospital, Outspan Hospital, Karen Hospital among others.

Record shows that two out of three people in Nyeri die from Non - Communicable Diseases.

The diseases, which have been attributed to lifestyle choices such as unhealthy diets, physical inactivity and excessive alcohol consumption, are also responsible for 55 per cent of hospital admissions. Cancer, diabetes, hypertension and asthma are the main ones afflicting Nyeri residents.

The prevalence of diabetes in the county is estimated at 6.4 per cent (triple the national prevalence) while that of hypertension is estimated at eight per cent. The Nyeri County Referral Hospital reports 700 new cancer cases annually.

# Governor witnesses signing of agreement by Rumukia FCS and Taifa Sacco

H.E Mutahi Kahiga witnessed the signing of the agreement between Rumukia Farmers' Co-operative Society Ltd and Taifa Sacco Society Ltd on the Kshs. 163 million loan inclusive of accrued interest that Rumukia FCS owes Taifa Sacco.

This was after Governor Kahiga intervened and facilitated negotiation between the two parties after Rumukia FCS in Mukurwe-ini sub-county was put on auction notice due to the outstanding debt that started in the year 2015 and has been

accumulating over the years. The County Government of Nyeri under the stewardship of the governor immediately intervened and held several meetings that led to the parties coming to the agreement that will see Taifa Sacco restructuring the loan repayment to a period of six years and waive the accrued interest of over Kshs. 20 million. The agreement was signed outside the governor's office by the representatives of the two societies led by their chairmen, Paul Chiera, Rumukia FCS and James Gitin'g'a of Taifa Sacco.

The two chairmen lauded the governor for his quick intervention and continued support by his government. This will bestow confidence to Rumukia FCS members and ensure that the two societies will continue to work together as they have done over the years, for the benefit of their members, in line with the sixth principle of co-operatives that encourages co-operation. The county government will also offer extension services to ensure farmers increase production and that governance is enhanced.

Mukurwe-ini West MCA Hon. Atanasio Wakabaire thanked the government for bringing on board the management of the two organizations which helped reach an agreement after a dialogue.

The leaders also condemned those hawking coffee from the area and urged authorities to take action immediately.

Rumukia FCS has a membership of over 8,000 and eight factories affiliated to the society and an average of 4 million kilograms of chery per year.

# Capacity building for laboratory technicians

Biosafety and biosecurity aspects have been highlighted as essential pillars of International Health Regulations and cross-cutting elements of biological non-proliferation.

In an effort to contribute to the achievement of safe laboratory practices, the County Government of Nyeri in partnership with Amref Health Africa in Kenya has organized a five-day capacity building exercise.

The training comprised of 15 lab managers drawn from various health facilities who were recently deployed and had not undergone this training yet.

During the training, they will acquaint themselves with the all the five modules; Overview of biosafety and biosecurity, Waste management, Biorisk assessment, Occupational safety

and Infection control, Safety Equipment and Emergency Response program.

The modules are in line with the Kenya Medical Laboratory Technicians and Technologists Board standard guidelines. At the end of the training, a completion certificate were awarded to each of the participants valid for one year.

Laboratory is one of the most critical areas in the health facility and comprises the highest mark of 17% of quality essential accreditation hence important to training lab personnel since they handle specimens that are a times dangerous.

Health CEC Dr. Rachel Kamau applauded the staff for their dedication to better service delivery.

She also noted that the county government is engaging a forward gear in

ensuring the staff is kept abreast on the dynamics of their areas.

Francis Gitonga, a TOT and a lab manager noted the training will be important in ensuring reduction of lab acquired infections as well as harmful incidences. He added that, in Nyeri County there are only two certified TOTs out of the minimum required of four.

Nyaga, a biosafety and biosecurity consultant noted that an evaluation assessment will be conducted as a follow up exercise to ensure sustainability for skills acquired.

At the end of the training, each participant came up with a specific work plan which will be used as a guide during assessment.

The County Government of Nyeri through the department of Gender, Youth and Social Services joined Huduma Center's Manager Florence Ndunge, together with the entire management in celebrating the Customer Service Week.



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


