## Nyeri Health Services Fund: the game changer

Under the Big 4 Agenda, the national government has remained focused on improving access to quality healthcare services for all citizens.

The government has put in place measures geared towards ensuring its citizens never lack health services including primary healthcare, emergency & preventive care, maternal/

child healthcare, access to drugs among others.

However, a need has arisen especially with the availability of drugs due to the delayed disbursement of monies to the devolved governments from the national government.

Subsequently, the effects of drug shortages have had a far-reaching

effect on patients' wellbeing and hospital's operations.

To mitigate this issue, the County Government of Nyeri under the leadership of H.E Governor Mutahi Kahiga has implemented the Nyeri County Health Services Fund which will address various challenges in the health sector.



While assenting the bill into law, governor Kahiga noted that, "I am committed to promoting affordable health care services, through such initiatives such as the Nyeri County Health Services Fund. The adoption of this bill is expected to revolutionize the health sector and enhance the efficacy in service delivery."

The Fund, which is administered in accordance with Section 116 of the Public Finance Management Act 2012, is facilitated through monies received as user fees payable or insurance payments collectable under this Act; Any income generated by a health facility from any project initiated by the health facility; or any other monies received from a lawful source.

The main objectives and purposes of the Fund are:

- To improve the quality of health care services- the fund guarantees that health facilities have better access to financial resources ensuring uninterrupted service delivery to Nyeri residents.
- Better response to emergencies- the Fund

will ensure hospitals are more responsive to medical and public health emergencies because part of the funding will finance running of county ambulances and emergency services.

- Availability of drugs- it will ensure availability of basic medical drugs in all facilities at all times.
- 100% reinvesting- monies collected will be reinvested back to the health facilities. Twenty per cent of the monies are set aside

for disbursement and are equitably allocated to primary health services.

The Nyeri County Health Services Fund is managed by a board which was recently inaugurated by governor Kahiga comprising of all chairmen from Level 4 hospitals, representatives from the County Government of Nyeri, a representative of rural facilities and the fund administrator.

The Board members are Richard Kimani, Dr. Francis Kimani, Jesse Kamau, Newton Wambugu (Health Chief Officer), Dr. Nelson Muriu (Health Director), John Ngugi (Finance Chief Officer) and is chaired by Anthony Mithanga.

The board provides oversight of the administration of the monies drawn from the Fund and mobilizes resources for the Fund. It further provides guidance to the hospital management boards on; proposals on user fees where the Hospital Board seeks to propose new user fees or changes to the old fees structure and approval of primary health services expenditure plans. Lastly, it receives reports from the Hospital management boards for its consideration and adoption.



The Fund is also administered by a Fund Administrator, who also doubles as the board's secretary. The administrator ensures that the earnings of, or accruals to a county public fund are retained in the fund, unless the County Executive Committee member for finance directs otherwise; Ensure that money held in the fund, including any earnings or accruals is spent only for the purposes for which the fund is established. He/she also prepares accounts for the fund for each financial year not later than three months after the end of each financial year, submit financial statements relating to those accounts to the County Treasury.



The administrator will also present the monthly and quarterly financial statements to the County Treasury and ensure that the accounts for the fund and the annual financial statements relating to those accounts comply with the accounting standards prescribed and published by the Accounting Standards Board from time to time.

The Fund board is also working hand in hand with the hospital management boards whose primary roles are to:

- approve programmes and plans of

the health services;

- prepare an annual budget estimates and plan for recommendation to be adopted by the Fund Board;
- formulate strategies on resource mobilisation;
- resolve any conflicts that arise amongst health Services whose nature is the allocation of resources, and/ or joint programmes;
- supervise health services, prepare reports and forward to the Fund Board;
- Identify implementation challenges

have already approved Kshs. 53 million towards the purchase of pharmaceuticals and non-pharmaceuticals following their first meeting. Mr. Mithanga added that the Board will be in close engagement with hospital management units to fulfill its audit and supervision function. The board called upon the Kenya Medical Supplies Authority (KEMSA) to disburse medical supplies which the counties have already ordered so as to curb the shortages of some drugs being experienced in the hospitals.

and seek corrective actions;

- Make policy recommendations on cost sharing, public awareness on health and administration of the fund; and
- Determine such number of standing committees and composition of ad hoc committees.

Other efforts by the County Government towards improving the health care system are:

- Construction of a level 4 hospital in Naromoru which will heavily decongest the Nyeri Referral Hospital as it will provide services to a huge unserved population.
- Installation of oxygen plants in Karatina and Mt. Kenya Level 4 Hospitals.
- Construction of an isolation ward at Mt. Kenya Level 4 Hospital.
- Establishment of a community health system with 2,510 CHVs.
- Recruitment of 198 health workers to strengthen the existing workforce.

During their first official presser, the board led by the chair Anthony Mithanga noted that the fund will be a game-changer for the health sector in Nyeri County. He added that they

Nyeri is the third county to implement this policy after Nakuru and Machakos.

**3 Availability of drugs**

Ensure availability of basic medical drugs in all facilities at all times.

**2 Better response to emergencies**

Ensure health facilities are more responsive to medical and public health emergencies because part of the funding will finance running of County ambulances and emergency services.

**4 No delayed pay**

Ensure that casual employees working in health centres and dispensaries are paid on time.

**5 100% reinvesting**

Ensure 100% of funds collected in all health facilities is fully ploughed back.

**6 Support primary services**

Ensure 20% of the funds collected in the health department is used to support primary health services.

# Meet Nyeri's longest serving cooperative officer; Julia Wamuyu Kanyogoro

Over her 38-year career, her responsibilities have been mostly cooperative advisory services based through attending general meetings, management committee meetings and education to members' forums. She has also conducted pre-cooperative training, helped register and promote cooperative societies.

Since 1908 when Kenya's first co-operative society was formed, the sector has continued to grow, becoming one of the world's great. Currently ranked first in Africa and seventh internationally, the co-operative movement has made significant milestones.

According to the Ministry of Trade and Industrialization statistics, co-operative sector has generated employment opportunities for over 500,000 people and indirectly for more than 3 million.

One such employee and co-operator is Julia Wamuyu Kanyogoro, who has worked in the cooperative sector for 38 years. Julia joined the sector in 1981 as a student in the co-operative college where she graduated in 1983. She worked in Kirinyaga and Nyeri as a Co-operative Officer under the State Department for Co-operatives. Following the inception of devolved governments, Julia joined the County Government of Nyeri where she has served in her role for the last nine years. So far she has worked in six of the eight sub-counties whereby her skills and expertise have been invaluable.

Julia is a committed co-operator who is very passionate about her work. She loves to see people grow and raise their standards, and this has been her driving force since she joined the co-operative industry. Further, she's been praised as a person who is always ready to share her knowledge and experiences to all adding that she has made it easy for other officers to serve the co-operative movement effectively.

"Her passion and determination has been very inspiring to us. I am sure she has transformed many lives during her 38 years of service. We are grateful for her selfless service and wish her all the best in her new chapter in life," added Theuri.

***How do you balance the work and the family for all the years?***

It's been quite challenging but prayers and support from my family has gone a long way. I ensure that we are in constant communication with the family as well as purposely make time to meet mostly on weekends.

***What kind of challenges have you experi-***

***enced?***

I abhor corruption hence faced quite the challenge as I experienced some of it during my initial years of employment. This is because corruption has led to the death of so many cooperatives even before the members have reaped any benefits.

***What message do you have for H.E Governor Mutahi Kahiga?***

I wish to thank Governor Kahiga for the opportunity to work in his government. He is a committed leader, particularly to his staff's welfare, seeing that we have never lacked our salaries on time. Governor Kahiga is a co-operator at heart and I would continue urging him to continue supporting sectors such as the coffee/tea/dairy in terms of value addition.

***I understand you are retiring on Sunday, 22nd August, what's your parting shot and message to cooperative leaders and the youth who are starting out in this industry?***

I am grateful to God for his favor at work, to my seniors for facilitating me adequately and allowing me to perform my duties with a bit of independence in decision making. To the Co-operative movement, I enjoyed working with and for you, though I retire from public service, I will always be available for consultation and advice.

I would encourage cooperative officers and youth starting out in this industry to love and be committed to their work as this will drive them to do it well. # Governor receives donation from GoalSmiles Onlus

Nyeri Governor H. E Mutahi Kahiga received a donation of medical supplies, kitchenware and furniture worth Ksh. 15 Million from GoalSmiles Onlus, a non-governmental organization in Italy.

The medical supplies donated include four complete dental units, assorted medical equipment, one ventilator, endoscopy equipment and maternity equipment. The kitchenware and furniture will go towards furnishing Nairutia Vocational Training Centre.

The donation is a fruition of the collaboration that came after Governor Kahiga and Kieni MP Hon. Kanini Kega visited Italy in 2019. The bilateral talks culminated to the signing of an MOU between the County Government of Nyeri and the Region of Veneto to collaborate on areas of education, agriculture and health.

Through this collaboration, the NGO is also constructing a multipurpose hall at Nairutia Vocational Training Centre and has injected a further Kshs. 2.6 Million towards its completion.



Further through this collaboration, Italian doctors will help in capacity building of health practitioners by training them on specialized treatment in endoscopy and renal treatment among other specialized services.

Speaking at the event, Hon. Kanini lauded the governor for the synergy that is being experienced between the county government and the national government in Nyeri.

Governor Kahiga reiterated this saying that leadership is about servitude hence why collaboration is paramount for the two governments. He thanked GoalSmile Onlus for their continued support and effort to elevate the living standards of Nyeri residents through this partnership.

The governor also called upon the treasury to be magnanimous when it comes to waiving of taxes of shipping of such donations so that they can get to the people without a heavy burden.

Three years and ten months since H.E Mutahi Kahiga took oath of office as the fourth governor of Nyeri, the transformation is evidently visible in all corners of the county.

Further, in a recent procurement compliance test by the Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA), Nyeri County was ranked first out of the 47 counties with a 75% score. And this is not all. The county topped among 24 counties in the recently completed assessment of the Kenya Climate Smart Agriculture Project (KCSAP) and it was also the most improved, maintaining the gold status from March to August 2020.

Governor Kahiga has brought a new life in the health sector by rehabilitating hospitals like the Nyeri Referral Hospital, Othaya, Karatina & Mt. Kenya Level 4 Hospitals. He has also renovated existing dispensaries as well as built new ones like Zaina, Githakwa and Muthangira. How dare I forget the Naromoru Level 4 hospital in Kieni East that is set to be operational soon? Mind you, in the current financial year 2021/2022 another level 4 hospital in Kieni West is also on the cards. Not long ago, H.E President Uhuru Kenyatta lauded the governor for fostering harmonious partnerships and his continued support to the Othaya Level VI Hospital-Kenyatta Annex which resulted in creation of impeccable quality health standards for the citizenry. The head of State even encouraged other governors to take the lead from the governor. The man is literally a work-

aholic, I suppose.

It would be unjust if I don't mention the construction of the ultra-modern Nyeri Town Main Transport Termini, a mega flagship project at Asian Quarters, set to decongest Nyeri CBD and create employment opportunities. The project is being implemented following a formidable partnership between the county government and the World Bank through the Kenya Urban Support Programme (KUSP). During his reign, stretches of roads totaling to 10.7 kms have been tarmacked, 1,058 kms murrammed and 3,709kms access roads rehabilitated in all the 30 wards.

The County Government of Nyeri under the leadership of Governor Kahiga has engaged development partners in pursuing Public -Private Partnership (PPP) business model, a viable mechanism which guarantees a return on investment and speedy completion of infrastructure. These business-oriented ties with the International entities and governments such as Britain, Israel, Italy, USAID, Hungary and Pakistan just to name a few, are rooted in the sectors of agriculture, health, education, trade manufacturing and housing sectors to mention but a few.

He is a man who has kept close Nyeri County's core values; growth, transparency & accountability to his heart. In his recent interview he said, "My greatest desire is that when I leave this office I will be able to walk these streets of Nyeri and somebody will stop somewhere and say during that man's reign there was peace, we got development (growth) and there was no corruption (transparency & accountability)."




