Cognizant of the adverse effects caused by climate change across the globe, there has been a need to incorporate renewable energy sources into our everyday activities. These kinds of energy sources which have gained both local and global momentum not only meet the energy demand

in a sustainable, reliable and affordable manner but also protect the environment. One type of this kind of energy is the biogas system, as such; it has been adopted by many people because it is a cheap and clean source of energy.

The County Government of

Nyeri under the leadership of H.E Governor Mutahi Kahiga has endeavored to protect the environment as well as transform the lives of its residents through building such innovate bio-digesters for their fuel needs.

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This project, under the ward specific projects, was piloted in Aguthi Gaaki ward, Tetu sub-county in the financial year 2019/2020, benefitting 5 families. The total cost was Kshs. 1M. Following the project's success, it has since been rolled out to another 17 families in the financial year 2020/21, through the Department of Transport, Public Works, Infrastructure and Energy at a total cost of Kshs. 3.39 M. The selection of beneficiaries

for the second phase was done through balloting, with the beneficiaries only having to purchase a cooker.

Area MCA Hon. Stanley Wakibia noted that following the success-



ful implementation of the first phase of bio gas production in 2020, he lobbied for more funds to build additional home biogas systems for 17 families through the ward specific projects.

“The dependence on firewood fuel poses an environmental challenge capable of aggravating the effects of climate change. As

a result, we are helping rural households switch to biogas systems because it is renewable, eco-friendly and affordable to them. Moreover, biogas residue provides organic fertilizer which is way better than inorganic fertilizer. With

only one cow, a farmer will get milk, manure and fuel,” said Hon. Wakibia.

Beneficiaries of this project have lauded the County Government of Nyeri noting that their lives have been significantly transformed.

Joshua Maina from Gititu thanked Governor Kahiga and Hon. Wakibia for installing a biogas project for their family noting that it is a cheap and an eco-friendly source of energy.

“The biogas has saved us money we previously used to purchase firewood and this means we don't cut down trees hence conserving the environment. To sustain the production of biogas, you only need cow dung which is readily available. Further, we use the waste products to plant vegetables like spinach and kales which have improved our nutrition,” added Maina.

Loise Wanjiku, another beneficiary from Kangaita expressed his gratitude to the County Government of Nyeri led by Governor Kahiga for such an innovative project which has improved their lives.

“I have been using this project for two weeks now and I can testify how good it is. As a woman, it has not only simplified household chores such as cooking for me but it has also saved me from the daunting task of firewood collection. I have also grown some vegetables using waste product from the biogas production, which has improved the nutrition status for my family,” added Loise.

Another beneficiary from Ithekehuno, John Macharia noted that the residents of Aguthi Gaaki agreed on biogas project following a public participation exercise in the ward. He expressed his gratitude to Governor Kahiga and Hon. Wakibia for this project which has significantly benefited not only his family but also





the larger community.

“By using energy from biogas production, it has notably reduced our household expenses such as buying of firewood as well as minimized the number of gas refilling as we mostly use the biogas for cooking,” he noted.

Cecilia Wangari from Thage-ini village thanked the county government for installing the biogas project for her noting that it has changed her life. Cecilia added

that it has eased her suffering by cutting costs she used to purchase firewood. More importantly, it has prevented her from being exposed to smoke anymore, which she added has had such negative implications to her eyesight.

“I am happy now because I can cook my food comfortably without disturbing my grandchildren. I wish to thank governor and the MCA for their collaboration which has seen such an innovative proj-



ect come into fruition and pray to God to continue blessing them,” noted Cecilia.


The department's CEC, Kariuki Muthui acknowledged that the county government has embraced the use of renewable sources of energy such as biogas and solar power as they are a cleaner and efficient form hence conserving the environment.

“Once people learned of the benefits of the biogas digesters, such as they are an inexpensive source of energy as it only requires a farmer to have only one cow to set up, they have since embraced them,” he said.

Indeed, the County Government of Nyeri is committed to conserving the environment by embracing eco-friendly sources of energy, with zero emissions into the atmosphere, hence a great way of combating global warming. Subsequently, through incorporating home biogas systems, it

will reduce the number of trees cut down, conserving the forest coverage, which currently stands at 38% in Nyeri County.

Nyeri youth development policy public participation

The participation of the youth in all aspects of the society is very important since they are an integral part for the development of any county or country.

The County Government of Nyeri is committed to empower the youth in a structured framework and that is why a public participation exercise was carried out which sought to provide Nyeri youth with an opportunity to integrate their voices, share their views, proposals into the policy, which will then inform the final draft.

Nyeri Governor H. E Mutahi Kahiga presided over the Nyeri Youth Development Policy - Youth public participation exercise held across all the eight sub-counties from the 13th to 22nd September, 2021.

The policy addresses issues affecting the youth in Nyeri by providing broad based objectives and strategies that will be implemented to give the youth meaningful opportunities to reach maximum potential. The policy also provides a framework on which all programmes and sectoral policies will base their efforts to mainstream issues affecting the youth at all levels including mechanism of accountability in the county.

The governor noted that:

- The youth forms the bulk of the population in Nyeri, and is the biggest asset and engine of growth and prosperity.
- The youth is a resource that can spur development as well as social economic growth in Nyeri County and the formulation of the



Nyeri Youth Development Policy is another milestone of CGN in achieving the youth development agenda.

- He encouraged the youth to continue voicing their opinions about the policy as they play a key role in the society hence a need to integrate them in matters leadership and governance.

- The county government is committed to empowering and growing the youth and has implemented programmes such as the internship programme and the Kuza Kazi programme. In the current financial year, the county government will also issue out merchandise and equipment to groups across 15 wards through the ward specific project. Further, he encouraged the youth to take advantage of government opportunities such as applying for the Access to Government Procurement Opportunities (AGPO) programme.

- In collaboration with the Ministry of ICT, the county government is setting up an ICT Hub with free Wi-Fi at the new Nyeri bus termini, to be used by the youth. Further, it will collaborate with the Kenya Film Commission to boost the film industry by setting up a hub for the same, subsequently, promoting local artists in the creative industry.

The Ministry of ICT CS Joe Mucheru, who attended the forum in Mukurwe-ini sub-county encouraged the youth to continue taking part in matters governance and leadership including policy formation emphasizing that they are the leaders of tomorrow. He also urged the youth to embrace team work and promote each other as well as to take advantage of all opportunities in government including the Ajira programme.

The youth public participation on the policy is a partnership between the County Government of Nyeri through the Department of Gender, Youth and Social services, in partnership with World Vision and Africa Youth Transformation.

Nyeri retains position one in KCSAP

Nyeri County has yet again emerged position one out of 24 counties during the 6th County Review Outstanding Performance for the Kenya Climate Smart Agriculture Project (KCSAP).

This win comes after Nyeri County was also named top of the list for the same outstanding performance in March 2020.

In the latest review, Nyeri County has surpassed several targets that were set for the counties that the project is being implemented in.

Nyeri County's achievements so far include;

1. Supporting 320 groups in Nyeri to adopt improved technologies, innovations and management practices to the tune of Ksh 266.7 million.
2. Enhancing Irrigation infrastructure through some 13 sub-projects to the tune of Ksh 248.5 million.
3. Supporting three producer organisations in dairy and potato to the tune of Ksh 40 million.
4. Mobilising 3 new producer cooperatives whose Enterprise Development Plans we are going to fund.
5. Recruiting and training 543 lead farmers who are going to be supporting us to deliver extension across different value chains among others.

The programme is being implemented in three sub-counties: Kieni East, Kieni West and Mukurwe-ini. H.E Governor Muta-hi Kahiga has so far commissioned projects like Kiria Dam in Gatarakwa ward, Lusoi Earth Dam in Thegu River ward, Thiha/Sagana Irrigation Scheme in Rugi and Mukurwe-ini Central wards as well as issued out cheques to farmers' groups and establishments such as Kieni Dairy.

The Kenya Climate Smart Agriculture Project (KCSAP) is a Government of Kenya project jointly supported by the World Bank. Its objective is to increase agricultural productivity and enhance resilience /coping mechanisms to climate change risks in the targeted small holder farming and pastoral communities in Kenya.

commodities worth 43 million shillings, half of the order Nyeri had made. KEMSA did not have some of the supplies ordered and as such, CGN is exploring other options to fill the gap.

Nyeri Governor H.E Mutahi Kahiga together with ICT, Innovation and Youth Affairs Cabinet Secretary Joe Mucheru officially launched the new Spectrum Management and Monitoring System (SMMS II) site at Wambugu Farm, Nyeri County.

The launch of the new SMMS II by the Communications Authority of Kenya is envisaged to greatly enhance service delivery to the spectrum users and stakeholders in the region; as well as expand its spectrum management capabilities across the country.

This is the 11th site to be launched nationally.

The system will manage and monitor frequencies within the Cen-



tral, Eastern and Northern Kenya regions.

Speaking at the event, the CS noted that this system, will complement other initiatives in place that will spur the growth of ICT in the county and the country at large through an enabling regulatory environment.

"The upgraded spectrum management and monitoring system will enable the Authority to resolve interference cases when they arise, as well as identify transmissions that don't conform to the established standards," he added.

The governor also lauded this milestone saying that the system will greatly enhance service

delivery for people intending to venture into the communication sector.

Governor Kahiga noted that the launch of the system in Nyeri County is a testament of the collaboration and fruitful partnership between the County Government of Nyeri and the national government which ultimately has enhanced service delivery for Nyerians.

The national government has also initiated many other projects in the county including tarmacking of roads, Chaka Industrial Hub, KNH Othaya annex among others.

Fish farming

The fisheries sector plays a significant role in socio-economic development including revenue generation, job creation as well as contributes to food security.

For this reason, the County Government of Nyeri in collaboration with the Aquaculture Business Development Programme (ABDP) has launched several initiatives geared towards supporting the sector such as restocking of dams, fish ponds and supporting fish farmers with aquaculture inputs.

One of the initiatives is the purchase of high quality feeds which H.E Governor Mutahi Kahiga flagged off at Hohwe Dam in Kirimukuyu ward, Mathira West sub-county.

The 5,500 Kgs of high quality fish

feeds will then be distributed to 220 farmers across the 30 wards to enhance fisheries productivity in their farms.

The fish feeds were purchased at a total cost of Kshs. 1.1 million allocated in the financial year 2020/21.

In this financial year 2021/2022, the county government has also set aside Ksh 6.1 million for; purchase and distribution of 7500 Kgs of fish feeds, procurement of 300, 000 fingerlings and procurement of two motorized fire glass boats.

Further, the county government will continue collaborating with the Aquaculture Business Development Programme (ABDP) to enhance marketing of fish including holding fish fair events in all the eight sub-counties.

Governor Kahiga noted that through these events, the community will be well informed on

the health benefits of fish subsequently increasing the number of fish consumers. He also encouraged the farmers' groups to create their own hatcheries, to supplement the fingerlings provided to them by the county government which will also boost fish farming.

Nyeri was ranked third out of the 15 ABDP implementing counties during the recently held annual review workshop in Kirinyaga.

The ABDP is a programme jointly funded by the Government of Kenya and the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD). The overall goal of the programme is to reduce poverty and increase food security and nutrition in rural communities.

Issuance of farm equipment in Kieni East

Nyeri Governor H.E Mutahi Kahiga issued farm equipment to farmers in Thegu River ward, Kieni East sub-county.

The farm items which included: 14 chaff cutters, 10 forage choppers and three bean threshers to Gathathi-ini Men Self Help Group from the Kenya Climate Smart Agriculture Programme Project (KCSAP) will help boost food production and livestock farming in the area.

Governor Kahiga urged the area residents to form more community groups so that they can benefit from such projects in order to enhance their lives wholly.

In Thegu River ward, KCSAP in conjunction with the County Government of Nyeri, has funded 31 farmer groups who have benefitted with over Ksh. 26 Million under micro project funding.

The funding has gone to four value

chains namely, Dairy cow value chain, Indigenous chicken value chain, Irish Potato value chain, beans value chain and natural resource management.

KCSAP is a World Bank funded project which is running in 24 counties nationally. Nyeri County was recently ranked number one the third time for the implementation of KCSAP projects.

KCSAP which aims at increasing agricultural productivity and building resilience to climate change risk is being implemented in three sub-counties in Nyeri County which are Kieni West, Kieni East and Mukurwe-ini sub-counties.

The County Government is committed to continue collaborating with KCSAP to increase agricultural productivity in the county seeing that agriculture is the backbone of Nyeri's economy.

Employability soft skills should be a necessity for every TVET graduate. However, these are skills which are lacking in most graduates; hence there is a need to empower them with the same improving their chances of employment.

In light of this, the County Government of Nyeri through the Department of Gender, Youth and Social Services has collaborated with Help Self Help Centre (HSHC) and has piloted a project which seeks to improve the employability of TVET graduates within the

county. The project is being supported by the Finish Embassy. In line with this, Nyeri Governor H.E Mutahi Kahiga met with a team from HSHC who updated him on the progress of the project so far.

Training is slated to be done on 28th and 29th of September, running concurrently in all the eight sub-counties for the 250 graduates who applied.

Upon the successful completion of the training, the participants will be awarded a certificate in

recognition of their added skills. Further, in partnership with KEP-SA, there will be a stakeholder's engagement meeting with the trainees to broaden their networks with potential employers.

The project will also see four innovative youth owned business ideas receive innovation awards. These will be from the most unique ideas that are linked to rural productive sectors. At least 60% of the four incubated, innovative business ideas are hoped to attract further up-scaling support from government, NGOS, pri-

private sector and impact funders.

Governor Kahiga lauded HSHC for this noble project emphasizing that there is a need for graduates to be trained on how to present themselves for the job market.

He noted that the county government has started a vigorous internship programme which provides a platform for graduates to gain work experience and called upon organizations in Nyeri to embrace the model and incorporate youth in their organizations so as to gain necessary skills.

Commissioning of Lusoi Earth Dam project

H.E Governor Mutahi Kahiga commissioned the Lusoi Earth Dam project in Thegu River ward, Kieni East sub-county. The project will cover about 125 acres and is set to benefit over 825 farmers. The dam is under the sub project category of the Kenya Climate Smart Agricultural Project (KCSAP) programmes and has been desilted and rehabilitated at a cost of about Kshs. 14.35 million. Further, Governor Kahiga presented cheques to Gakawa and Thegu Community Driven Development Committees

lion and Kshs. 23.61 million respectively. He also issued out knapsack sprayers and Hose pipes to members of Common Interest Groups and Vulnerable Marginalized Groups in Thegu and Gakawa wards. In this financial year 2021/22, about Kshs. 8.88 million has been allocated for the upgrading of water intake, conveyance and distribution of irrigation pipes (7km) of Mureru Irrigation Water Project. The project will benefit over 566 farmers with a coverage of 87 acres.

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Nyeri youth development policy

This is not the first time the county has attempted to draft such a policy. In the first regime a draft document was compiled but somehow was never implemented.

I have always encouraged youth to participate in Governance and in late 2018 a few of us had a sit down with the newly appointed CEC Gender, Youth and Social Services Esther Ndung'u.

Our main concern was that her department had no allocation for youth empowerment programs as there was an unwritten rule that youth were never devolved.

This became a challenge anytime the youth came up with innovative ideas that needed the support of the department.

In that first engagement we agreed on two main things; The need for a policy document and that the youth must be involved at subcounty level.

A policy document is important as it's a rule that hopefully better guides decisions, resulting in positive outcomes that enhance the unit.

Earlier this year in the month of June, the County Assembly of Nyeri drafted the Nyeri Youth Development Bill 2021 in which a number of youths from across the county gave their input. The bill was approved and assented to by H.E Mutahi Kahiga earlier this month.

The bill created a framework for establishment of a youth development committee, its functions and objectives. However, there are more youth issues that need to be addressed and required a robust policy framework.

I was excited to learn that World Vision, Africa Youth Transformation and AMREF had partnered with the department in holding Subcounty public participation forums. Initially the target number was 100 youth leaders per subcounty but this was reduced to 50 under the Ministry of Health Covid 19 protocols.

The forums took place from Sept

13th to Sept 22nd involving over 400 youth leaders mobilized from the wards within each subcounty.

The youth were split into five groups and tackled 11 thematic areas namely; Education, training & entrepreneurial skills development, health, labour & unemployment, agriculture & agribusiness, drug & substance abuse, ICT & innovation, arts & sports, SGBV, governance & leadership, environmental sustainability, inclusion and social justice.

Each group had to identify the existing opportunities within the county, capture challenges, interventions and stakeholders under each thematic area.

Each group was able to present their work to H.E Mutahi Kahiga who was able to attend all the 8 subcounty forums and engage the youth leaders on various issues.

In Mukurweini the youth had a chance to interact with Mr. Joe Mucheru, the Cabinet Secretary for Ministry of ICT, Innovation and Youth Affairs.

In Mathira East, we had a

benchmarking visit from the CEC Gender and Youth, County Government of Kirinyaga Dr Margaret Mithamo.

Mr. Alex Sapingot of Africa Youth Transformation was able to join the youth in the first four sub-counties while some MCAs were able to join some of the forums.

From this point the department shall compile all the views from the subcounties and then presented at a stakeholders meeting.

The stakeholders meeting shall come up with a draft policy that must undergo validation from the youth to ensure that it has captured everything the youth proposed.

Once the document is validated it shall be presented to cabinet for approval and then submitted to the County Assembly of Nyeri for further deliberations and approval.

His Excellency the Governor assured the youth that the policy shall be signed by December this year.

I wish to thank everyone involved in this process and for those who feel they were left out there shall be an opportunity at validation stage for everyone to give their input.
