Municipality of Nyeri has had notable successful changes since its formation in August 2018. This is accredited to the exceptional work done by the Nyeri Municipal Board in conjunction with the County Government of Nyeri. In their two-year stint in office, the ten-member team has made exponential progress in mirroring the model image of Nyeri Municipality as one committed to development, accountability and transparency.

Its inception came about following legal procedures as stipulated in the Urban Areas and Cities Act (No. 13 of 2011). The key mandate delegated is to ensure all affairs undertaken in the municipality are done and

attained in fullness.

The municipality covers an area of 167km², comprising of five wards; Kamakwa/Mukaro, Kiganjo/Mathari, Gatitu/Muruguru, Rware and Ruring'u. This also includes areas of Nyeri town, Chaka Township and Marua.

The Municipal Board developed a Municipality Integrated Development Plan (IDEP), a five-year plan that guides the execution of priority projects and projects within the municipality.

The Municipal Board in collaboration with the Department of Lands, Housing, Physical Planning and Urbanization is currently constructing the Nyeri

Town Bus Termini, a mega flagship project situated at Asian Quarters.

It is funded by the World Bank under the Kenya Urban Support Programme (KUSP) in partnership with the County Government of Nyeri. The bus park, set to be one of the largest smart termini hubs in Kenya, will create an affordable and efficient transport mechanism which a truly inclusive society needs access to. Not only will it reduce traffic and human congestion within the Central Business District but it will also create job opportunities to thousands of area residents.

Nyeri Municipality's transformation two years after



Nyeri Governor H.E Mutahi Kahiga has termed the multi-million project as transformational noting that it will bring about an economic turn around and progression for the people of Nyeri, taking it back to its lost glory as an ideal place to live and work in for generations to come.

The terminus is being constructed in two phases from year 2019 – 2022 with the first phase being allocated about Ksh. 600 million. Once complete, the terminus will have 1,000 business stalls, six restaurants, 240 matatu stages, taxi bays, Tuk Tuk bays, 98 booking bays, 51 lorry bays, 94 passenger waiting bays and ticket offices. Other amenities will include a fire sub-station, a police post, a power sub-station, a garage, five sanitation blocks, an open air market, shops and block of offices and an ICT hub.

Rehabilitation of access roads in the neighbouring estates has also been done to ease traffic movement and street lighting projects to enable a 24-hour economy. The project which started in June last year has created jobs for hundreds of youths per day who have been involved in construction. The first phase is 80% complete and is expected to be complete by December, 2020.

“We are committed to reviving the town's infrastructure and our plan is to approach the outskirts of Nyeri. With the Asian Quarters Bus Termini, we will have a very robust economy which is the real outcome of devolution,” governor Kahiga said.

Nyeri Lands CEC Dr. Kwai Wanjaria, projected that

the terminus will employ approximately 7,000 people on a daily basis and also have daily movement of over 20,000 passengers once operational. He also highlighted that it will develop a dormant Asian Quarters with land prices hiking exponentially.

The project has already acquired requisite certification having met the required criteria after all regulatory bodies such as NEMA and KeNHA approved construction with the latter approving the licensing of expansion of Kenyatta road.

The Municipal Board chairman Jeremiah Ichaura said the project has been a major milestone that has enabled reclamation of an illegal dumpsite into a model bus park. This has been achieved through collaboration with other county departments.

“This nine-acre piece of land was a dumpsite two years ago and is now a model bus park set to create employment and decongest the CBD. The ICT hub in the terminus will place our youth at a globally competitive scene in the online job market,” said Ichaura.

Lands Chief Officer Hannah Maranga echoed Ichaura's words adding that the ICT hub is critical during this digital age as it has come with assistance from the Ministry of ICT and will provide a proper working environment in an urban economy and provide free Wi-Fi for those who endeavor to work using the internet.

Nyeri traders led by Samuel Kamami, chairman Miariro Sacco have expressed their eagerness to start utilizing the new terminus.

“Rehabilitation of access roads in the neighbouring estates has also been done to ease traffic movement and street lighting projects to enable a 24-hour economy. The project which started in June last year has created jobs for hundreds of youths per day who have been involved in construction. The first phase is 80% complete and is expected to be complete by December, 2020.”

“We are happy as Miariro people since we know that our struggles are about to end with the setting up of market spaces for traders. Once operational, will change the story of many Miariro traders who strive to do business especially during the rainy seasons,” he said.

Rose Wanjiru, a trader at Kamukunji lamented how hard it has been trading in Kamukunji with Covid-19 pandemic ravaging businesses but hopes that the opening of the stalls will put her and other traders at a level ground to trade.

Nyeri matatu operators led by 2NK Sacco chair James Kahiro also appreciated the efforts made by the county government for coming up with the expansive ultra-modern transport termini.

“The county government has done us good as the matatu sector. Traffic congestion, that has been cumbersome in town, will come to an end. The stalls in the termini, if well utilized, will place us a notch higher in terms of business,” said Kahiro.

Faith Muthoni, a labourer in the construction works, lauded the efforts by the Governor Kahiga –led administration in ensuring the labourers have a source of income to fend for their families amid the Covid-19 pandemic. In the past two years, the board, in collaboration with the Department of Lands has further embarked on giving Nyeri town a facelift including construction, rehabilitation and maintenance of municipal roads, drainage systems, municipal markets and marking of parking bays, which has seen hundreds of Nyerians employed.

The board has also been committed to creating spaces that are clean and safe with an aim of improving the health of those who live in them. To address the challenge of garbage collection, it has developed a Solid Waste Management Plan & Policy. In collaboration with the Department of Environment & Sanitation, they have purchased skip loaders and litter bins that have been placed in strategic points within the municipality.

With the formulation of the County Spatial Plan, the board, in tandem with the national government, has overseen the planning of Chaka town owing to its revamped status in terms of industrial competence.

Perister Kigwa, the municipal manager who is also the secretary of the board said the revitalization of the town will spur economic growth in the area.

“The planning of Chaka town will guide in development of the area. Chaka citizenry are encouraged to construct commercial storeys to maximize commercial activities within the town,” added Perister.

With the construction of Chaka Market and the resurgence of the Nairobi-Nanyuki railway line, the area’s produce will mature beneficial economic benefits to the town. The board has since developed plans that will guide in construction of a matatu stage which will be integrated with the market and train station.

Ichaura revealed that in the second phase, the board will engage in town beautification, provision of walkways and streets capping as a means of service delivery to the Nyeri citizenry.

Governor Kahiga, however, cautioned the residents

against falling victims to con artists disguising as county officials to collect money from unsuspecting citizens for allocation of spaces at Asian Quarters Bus Termini. He said that the county government has not started allocating stalls to anyone and will publicize the allocation exercise to ensure transparency.

If the county keeps building on these successes, the municipality will attract the right investment, further creating a liberated society where all persons are treated fairly and everyone has the opportunity to thrive.

Mental wellness is important to all including mental health wellness promoters. Psychological counsellors play a key role in helping others navigate through difficult occurrences and putting them into perspective.

In a bid to ensure their wellbeing too, the Department of Health Services in collaboration with Amref Health Africa organized a debriefing session which gave them a platform to share their experiences in the course of caring for others.

Debriefing has been proven to lessen anxiety disorders and contribute to long term relief from difficult emotional issues. It also gives them a platform to reflect and process challenging encounters as well as build a network for support.

In this time of Covid-19, some noted that they have been actively involved in providing psycho-social support to frontline health workers, Covid-19 patients and also others in need of their services. A plan to roll out such sessions monthly is underway.

Pain isn't always obvious. Its impact can be felt and in a worst-case scenario leads to loss of lives. September marks the National Suicide Awareness Month that is celebrated on the 10th alongside a one-month awareness campaign. The main rationale for this is to raise awareness on suicide prevention, reduce stigma revolving around the topic and come up with ways to minimize the risk of suicide.

Suicide impacts not only the victim but the family and the entire community. Out of the various causes of suicide, depression has been identified as a major cause contributing to up to two third.

Depression is a mental health disorder characterized by persistently disconsolate mood or loss of interest in activities, causing significant impairment in daily life. Identifying depression can sometimes be hard and can range from major depression (severe symptoms) or minor depression (may not last long). Loss of interest, lack of sleep, mood swings, poor hygiene, drug abuse, reckless behavior, irritability and suicidal thoughts are some of the signs of depression.

Individuals are encouraged to be on the lookout for their mental health, being aware of individual signs and especially when one under the pressure of a long time struggle or faced with a grave matter is important. One should seek help from a counselor or talk to someone they trust.

When helping someone who is depressed or with a suicidal approach the person with empathy and creates a good rapport so that they can be confident in your trustworthiness. Avoid the fallacy that those people who talk about suicide never act on it rather a call for help.

Even as the world marks this campaign, the County Government of Nyeri continues to engage active intervention at the grassroots. This is being done by conducting community education through health talks, deploying staff; counselors and psychiatrists who are tasked with the role of directing their expertise to those who need it.



Nyeri Transport, Public Works and Infrastructure CEC Muthui Kariuki has issued a stern warning against livestock straying in towns and urged the owners to withdraw them from the urban centers with immediate effect.

Muthui has attributed the traffic snarl-ups to the inconveniences posed by the domestic animals, saying the animals have also become a nuisance.

He urged the livestock owners to withdraw the animals from the towns of Nyeri, Karatina, Othaya and Narumoru, failure to which the county government will impound them immediately. For the owners to get back their animals they will have to pay heavy penalties within specific timelines or else their animals will be auctioned.

“...as per the by-laws of the county, the County Government of Nyeri will have no alternative but to impound those animals. Upon which for the owners to get them back, they will have to pay certain penalties, within a specified period. And in any case in which period, if they do not reclaim those animals, the government will have no alternative but to auction them,” CEC Muthui.

Patient safety has been recognized as a global priority hence given a commencement annually on 17th September. To ensure the effectiveness of patient safety, a health worker offering the services must be safe too, hence, the theme for this year's celebration, 'Health Worker Safety: A Priority for Patient Safety' which reflects the necessity of ensuring the safety of health care providers prior that of a patient.

World Patient Safety Day calls for global action to improve the safety of patients under home-based care as well as at the health facility.

According to medical needs, no one should be harmed during health service delivery.

In the face of Covid-19, the experience from the past months has unveiled a wide range of risks that health workers face associated with stigma, infections and psychological effects. This reflects that if a health worker is not safe, a patient receiving services is exposed to various risks too.

In an effort to ensure the safety of patients in Nyeri, the county government continues to engage a forward gear by subjecting health workers from all cadres in intensive training to bring them abreast with the dynamics revolving around their safety and ensuring that of their clients.

The signature mark for this day is lighting up a monument at the County Referral Hospital and webinar bringing together health workers from various institutions to discuss the way forward in ensuring safety for all and especially at the face of Covid-19.

Chief Officer Newton Wambugu, noted that safety is continuous. Patient safety is to be safeguarded since being a patient is not a choice, anyone can be a candidate and entitlement to safety is of importance. He added that, in as much as the county government ensures availability of personal protective equipment, it is important to make use of them properly in order to serve the purpose they are intended for, Safety.

Director of Health Services Dr. Nelson Muriu (*pictured*), noted that even as health workers dedicate their time to delivering top-notch services, they should ensure their safety and especially by paying attention to small details like proper handwashing.

The parameters addressed included; availability of drugs, human resource capacity and training, UHC program, UHC enablers and mobile clinics.

Governor Kahiga committed to fully support the health docket including progressively increasing the health budget to ensure efficient service delivery.

He also called upon creation of policies/guide-

lines that will make health-care available and affordable to mwananchi in partnership with National Health Insurance Fund (NHIF).

Governor Kahiga further encouraged the use of Community Health Volunteers (CHVs) to curb the influx of diseases within the county.

On the status of UHC, he noted that the program was a success however it required additional resources in areas of ICT infrastructure and electrification of health centres which posed a challenge.

Dr. Kamuri committed to ensuring a collaborative working relationship with the County Government of Nyeri, particularly in the running of KNH Othaya Annex which is currently being installed with an oxygen generating plant, laundry, mortuary and expanding the kitchen.

He also pledged to continue sustaining outreaches done by KNH whose impact has been immeasurable, and also lobby for the county to be provided with more (NCDs) drugs which have been a challenge.

Thaithi Health Centre to be transformed into a rehab centre

The facility, which was constructed in 2008 has not been operational for the past 12 years. As such, the community had proposed they

have a rehabilitation centre in place.

Gender CEC Esther Ndung'u, area MCA Hon. Muriithi Ndagita, NACADA regional director Amos Warui and other stakeholders visited the facility to assess its suitability to be converted into a rehabilitation centre.

The CEC reiterated that Governor Kahiga is committed towards expansion of treatment and rehabilitation services in the county as drug and substance abuse is a social problem that re-

quires specialized treatment just like any other disease.

Amos Warui from NACADA affirmed that the facility is up to standard and requires just a few refurbishments to get it running. He confirmed that they will be working closely with the county government to ensure that operations starts as soon as possible.

Area MCA Hon. Muriithi Ndagita pledged his support to the project by lobbying for financial allocation for its operationalization.
